The Committee authorised the librarian to send the pictures at once.”

Page 142, 13 August 1890. Item 10. Models of Men of War in Museum

“The Librarian directed attention to the condition of the models of the Ships of War presented by the Trinity House, the rigging which had rotted and was broken in many places. As the models were so large and finely executed, & so interesting as accurate models of the Men of War of the time of Lord Duncan and Nelson, it was resolved to them properly repaired, & the Librarian was instructed to get some old & experienced sailors to undertake the work.”

Page 144, 11 September 1890. Item 5. Repairs of Models of Ships

“The Librarian reported that as instructed at last meeting he had found two competent sailors (J Richards and D Milne) who had undertaken to repair the rigging and hulls of the fine models of the Men of War in the Museum. He had agreed to pay them at the rate of six pence per hour – and the work would be finished in a most satisfactory manner in a few days more. The Committee approved of what had been done in the matter.”

“Joseph Richards and David Milne, repairing “Men of War” models £8 15/6d.”

Page 158, 12 February 1891. Donations of specimens from the Arctic by whalers for the Museum.

In valuing loan pictures, the Owners or Trustees are to be consulted. Clerk to be appointed Insurance Agent.

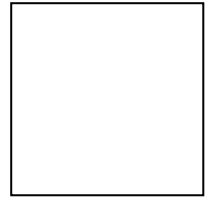
Page 300 and 301, 6 April 1908, Insurance of Lent Pictures and Specimens – reference was made to “Scotsman” article recording articles lent to Royal Scottish Museum were at owners’ risk and were not insured.

Page 305, 9 April 1908, (it was) decided the Committee should insure pictures and articles lent to the Institute, when the owners have not insured them specially.

Page 1, 5 December 1911. Re Caledonian Canoe at Dudhope Museum.

Page 9, 15 December 1911. "Book of the Covenant" 1643 purchased for £50 (gift from Mr. C.W. Scrimgeour, Mount Tabar, Dundee) and presented to the City.

Page 17, 11 January 1912. Captain Scott of MARS presented with five silver swimming medals

Page 23, 17 January 1912. - Seamen's Fraternity Pictures

On the motion of Baillie Foggie, the Clerk was instructed to write to Messrs J & J Hunter, Solicitors, as agents for the Seamen's Fraternity in Dundee asking that the pictures now on loan to the Free Library Committee should be presented to the City. These are "The Wreck of the Forfarshire" by T.M.Joy, "Portrait of Grace Darling", and "Portrait of William Darling," by the same artist, and "Portrait of Admiral Duncan".

Page 25-26. 24 January 1912. The matter of inventories was discussed and a scheme for making permanent inventories, recording pictures received on loan for the Galleries, with dates received, when returned and when lent elsewhere.

Page 34, 5 February 1912, Matter of permanent inventories further discussed.

Page 67, 29 April 1912. Re Naval Records.

The Clerk reported that 36 volumes of publications by the Navy Records Society offered by Sir John Knox Laughton, had been received, the only cost being that of binding the printed sheets.

It was agreed a special letter of thanks should be sent to Sir John Laughton for this gift.

Page 74, 9 May 1912. Letter received from Messrs R.A. Mudie acknowledging receipt of model of SS AURORA from Dudhope Museum.

Page 87, 13 June 1912. {Portraits of Captain Speedy of the DP&L Company's steamers, and of his wife), presented through Mr. Walter Speedy.

It was reported that Messr. R. A. Mudie & Co had received back the half models of SS AURORA and SS GLOANINGA that had been lent to Dudhope Museum.

Page 105, 8 August 1912. Re loan of 7 exhibits from Dudhope Museum to the Glasgow Steamship Exhibition at present open.

Page 125, 20 November 1912. Pictures belonging to Seamen's Fraternity.

The Clerk explained that, by instruction from the Committee of Management in January last, he had written to Messrs. J. & J. Hunter, Dundee, Agents for the Seamen's Fraternity.

A letter from Mr W Senior, Editor of the "The Mariner's Mirror" was read, asking for descriptions of ship-models of 17th and 18th centuries in possession of the Committee. The request was granted and the Clerk was instructed to communicate with Mr Senior.

Page 161, 10 March 1913. Reference Insurance and lenders being asked to provide listed values on exhibits.

Page 205, 12 June 1913. Received from David Smith, Dundee, silhouette portrait of Captain Buist, Dundee, Circa 1850.

Page 226 Storage of pictures and disposal of pictures and frames at Ward Road (said to be of little value.)

Page 231, 26 September 1913. Surplus pictures lent to Town Council for hanging in Caird Rest. [Items listed but none on loan from the Fraternity.]

Page 274, 20 January 1914. Items from Balaclava found on field by Captain Henry Campbell of the barque WITCH which carried stores to the seat of War.

Presented by Mr William Hunter, Beach Tower, Broughty Ferry.

Page 275, 20 January 1914 Ship models at Dudhope (Museum).

Mr Phillips called attention to the three Ship Models at Dudhope Museum which belong to the Seamen's Fraternity of Dundee, and suggested that these should be put in proper order.

The Committee decided unanimously to recommend this matter to the Committee of Management.

Page 285, 12 February 1914. Exhibition of Antarctic Pictures.

Letter received from Mr. David Wylie, Secretary of Dundee Branch of Scottish Geographical Society re exhibitions of Antarctic sketches by the late Dr. Wilson (to be held) during the month of March.

{NOTE: Dr. Wilson was Dr. E. T. Wilson who was one of the Polar Party led by Scott and who all perished on the return journey from the South Pole.)

Page 311. The exhibition of Antarctic sketches was the most popular exhibition held in Dundee with 37, 154 persons visiting the exhibition between 4 to 19 March 1914.

Page 190, 2 September 1929. Reference to Naval Exhibition in Edinburgh.

Page 254, 10 February 1930. Received an offer to purchase Half Model of SV LOCHEE (presented by Messrs Stephens, Dundee). The Committee agreed they had no power to sell Exhibits presented to the Department.

Page 339, 6 October 1930. Received request from Mr. Hugh Oldham, Middlesex to procure photographs of ship models at Dudhope. Agreed but must be of models in cases.

Page 442, 3 August 1931. Letter from Liverpool Organisation requesting loan of ships models and sailing whaler ... Committee decided to recommend that as we have no whaler model and the most valuable and suitable of the models at Dudhope are on loan, the request be not granted.

Page 37, 5 September 1938, re Grace Darling Pictures:

It was reported that the three Grace Darling pictures had been safely returned from Newcastle with a letter of thanks from the Curator.

Page 62, 5 December 1938. Offer of a model galleon 4'6" x 4' 6", no name, but had been made for a "Drake" competition and won an award.

Model maker and donor Mr. D. S. Grout, Dundee. Offer accepted.

Page 63. Offer of model of MAULSDEN, built at Dundee by Alexander Stephen & Son in 1875, by W. J. Walker, West Newport. Offer accepted.

Page 230. Agreed to pay £250 to MacIntosh Patrick for painting "A city garden".

Page 359. 12 May 1941. Death of Mr. A. S. Webster, Chief Librarian.

Page 2, 9 February 1942. Re patents, 13 ½ tons as salvage. QUERY THIS.

Page 9. Offer of two watercolour drawings by McIntosh Patrick:

Offer at £12 12/- each from Robertson & Bruce. Offer accepted.

Page 29-30, 11 May 1942. Reference to damage to Dudhope Museum after occupation by Military Units 1939 – 1942 inc.

Page 183, 9 August 1943. Donation of added plan of HMS CEYLON.

Page 244, 7 February 1944. Donation of Chinese 10 Dollar note from Chung Sing Ling, and Chinese 1 Dollar note from Sing Less Kue, both Merchant Navy SS ORISKANY.

Page 293, 9 June 1944. Acceptance of Gifts.

All future gifts to be accepted on condition they could be disposed of at the discretion of the Committee.

Page 385, 7 May 1945. Return of pictures from Crombie and Linlathen. Noted the picture store (at Albert Square) had been in use as a public Air Raid Shelter since the beginning of hostilities.

VOLUME 17, June 1946 to 1948

Page 76, 10 June 1946. Agreed the (Albert) Institute for membership of the Scottish Museums Federation.

Page 91, 5 August 1946. Donation of a letter dated 9 November 1858 from Lady Franklin to Captain Simpson of whaler HEROINE of Dundee.

Page 113, 23 August 1946. Agreed 32 pictures be on loan to Council for opening of Camperdown House.

Page 135, 9 September 1946. Further reference to pictures at Camperdown House.

Page 161, 5 December 1949. Disposal of torpedo.

NOTE: This was a German torpedo from Great War and was on display below display cases in the main ground floor gallery opposite the old main entrance.

Page 169, 9 December 1946. Following items removed to Camperdown House:

model of Dundee built DOSINA
old Dundee model (of central Dundee Circa 1880)
1914-1918 War Memorial.

Page 170, 9 December 1946. Revaluation of insurance on pictures, and reference to Dr. Honeyman of Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Stanley Cursiter, Director, National Gallery of Scotland.

Page 186, 7 April 1950 (?) donation of photographs and documents relating to Dundee flier W. Preston Watson.

Page 265, 11 August 1947. Offer of donation of narwhal tusk.

Largest known narwhal tusk is one brought out by Peary after his last expedition, and is 8' 00" long and 8" at the base (probably diameter at base), now in American Museum of Natural History.

The narwhal tusk now offered is 8' 3" long and 1' 4" diameter at the butt.

Page 414, 5 December 1949. Forty Nine pictures moved from Camperdown House.

Page 391, 10 December 1951. Reference to proposed Maritime Museum at Ward Road Galleries. In reply to a question the Curator said the models would remain on display at Ward Road and not returned to Dudhope Museum.
