

### **Council Act January 1724**

Att Dundie the seventh Day of January one Thousand seven hundred and twenty four years. Which day the Provost, baillies, Dean of Gild and remanent members of council of the Burgh of Dundie being mett and convened within the Councell house thereof consulting about the common affairs of the sd Burgh The Provost reported that he and the rest of the Commitie formerly appointed for visiting the place in the East Kirk where the maltmen were Demanding ane addition to their Seatt had accordingly visited the same, And that the Maltmen were demanding Liberty to build a Pew of addition before the seat they presently possess at the back of the Pulpit. And that they were also Demanding Liberty to build a long Pew and three short Pews before the Timbermens seat in the east Kirk south from Balgay's Seatt, in which three short Pews the little west most Pew No (*blank*) presently possest by William Douglass is to be taken in and for which the maltmen are to pay one pound ten shilling Scots yearly to the Kirkmaster. And to build the sd Pews of winescott on their own Charges. Which the Counsall considering after voteing Did and hereby doe grant and allow to the Maltmen of this burgh the Liberty and privilege of Building the sd Pews on their own Charges of winescott and paying the sd one pound ten shilling Scots yearly to the Kirkmaster.
